VISION



History



Located a stone's throw from the Dallas Metroplex in the vibrant, authentic small-town community of <u>Waxahachie, TX</u>, St. Joseph Catholic School has served its parish and surrounding communities for the last 30-plus years. Established in 1992 as the 30th Catholic elementary school in the Diocese of Dallas and the first in Waxahachie, St. Joseph Catholic School (SJCS) opened its doors to 44 students in preschool through first grade. By 1998, the School had added a new grade level each successive year and was offering classes through sixth grade. Under new administration in 2001, it was clear that a junior high was needed to allow the School to thrive, and thus a seventh and eighth grade were added in successive years.

With these additional grade levels, a change in curricular and extracurricular programing was necessary. Over time, science and technology labs were added with assistance through grant funding. The School's art, music, and sports programs were expanded through financial assistance and the generous support of volunteer parents and dedicated teachers. Today, SJCS is home to approximately 160 PK3-8 students and attracts a diverse population from the parish and surrounding communities. True to its mission, SJCS seeks to form saints and scholars through Catholic spiritual formation, emphasizing academic excellence, social growth, and service to others.

Programs

St. Joseph Catholic School has continued to grow and develop its programs to meet the needs of students and strengthen academic rigor. The Diocesan <u>curriculum</u> serves as a model for content and pacing at each grade level. Core elementary subjects include: English language arts, math, religion, science, and social studies. Offerings in art, music, Spanish, and physical education round out the whole-child approach to the students' education. One-to-one technology is integrated at every grade level from K-8, and all students are exposed to STREAM in all their classes. The SY 2019 saw the development of a Resource Department to be of greater service to the students and their families. More recently, the School updated its program support for students with dyslexia and is in the process of developing an enrichment program for students who need individual challenges. A Learning Lab serves as a space for students to go who need extra time on tests or classwork. As well, an expanded math program is in progress that will include additional instructional time and web-based programs to reinforce skills as well as propel students toward advanced concepts.





Extracurricular programs include nine sports for Grades 5-8 sponsored by the Dallas Parochial League (DPL). Student life opportunities are available in the form of clubs, leadership positions, and community service. Students in Grades 4-8 are eligible to be student ambassadors who promote SJCS during school open houses and other events. The SJCS Student Council, comprised of three eighth grade officers and two representatives from respective classrooms in grades 4-8, is a service organization that upholds the traditions and philosophy of St. Joseph Catholic School in areas of faith, school spirit, environment, and safety. The Council's duties include development of qualities of leadership and awareness of service to SJCS, parish, and community.





Programs



At its heart, St. Joseph Catholic School provides a faith-filled, nurturing environment coupled with a rigorous academic program. The small classroom setting enables teachers to work closely with students to achieve excellence in faith, academics, service, and character. Each day at SJSC students enter a nurturing and engaging environment where they are genuinely welcomed by all. The School offers a uniquely close-knit environment—an atmosphere that can serve as its touchstone even as enrollment grows. In everything the School does, Christ is at the center.

Among the Principal's many responsibilities are the oversight and coordination of all academic aspects of the school, including management and formation of teachers and staff, development of curriculum, student discipline, recruitment and retention activities, and management of student interventions. Parents and teachers alike describe St. Joseph's as "a small school with a big heart." The next Principal will find a newly appointed President who is committed to the future excellence of the School, a supportive and involved pastor, parents as partners, dedicated teachers, and hard-working volunteers.



Opportunities & Challenges



Opportunities for the next Principal abound at SJCS. S/he will be able to build on the excellent work already accomplished by the steady and experienced hand of the current Interim Administrator who was recently appointed President. A five-year strategic plan has recently been developed and is in Phase I of implementation this SY2023. Overall goals include: implementation of the President-Principal leadership model; faith formation; academic excellence; student recruitment and retention; faculty support; infrastructure, including security; upgrades and expansion of facilities; and technology integration. With the appointment of a President, the next Principal can focus on the School's growth in academics and student life programming, Catholic identity, and technology integration, and leave the fundraising and business side of the School to the successful efforts of the President.

Yet, the next Principal will face several challenges in leading SJCS into the future, as schools with limited resources often do. As such, the next Principal will be asked to focus on the following priorities for the next three to five years:

- Enhance faith formation and a strong Catholic identity.
- Develop outstanding programs at all grades levels and in all areas of the School.
- Recruit and retain students and families.
- Recruit exceptionally talented and qualified teachers and staff.
- Improve instruction by providing coaching and professional development opportunities for faculty and staff.
- Improve communication across all sectors through consistent and effective means.
- Set high standards of excellence.
- Understand and work within the President-Principal model.
